

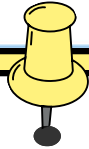

It has been another busy term and we wanted to share with you some of what has been happening in classes throughout school.

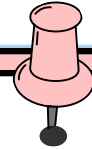
CLASS 1



In EYFS, the children have been fascinated by watching the progression of our caterpillars each day. Inspired by our focus story, *The Very Hungry Caterpillar*, we have been learning about the lifecycle of a butterfly and exploring each stage closely. The children observed how the tiny caterpillars grew bigger, formed chrysalises and eventually transformed. They used descriptive language, shared their ideas and asked thoughtful questions about what might happen next. Through discussions, drawings and observations, the children developed a deeper understanding of change, growth and nature. They showed great excitement, curiosity and care while looking after our caterpillars together in class daily.



CLASS 2



GROW

Class 2 have had a busy and exciting half term full of learning. In their plants topic, the children have enjoyed growing their own seeds and watching them change over time. In history, they have been exploring how toys have changed from the past to the present, sparking lots of curiosity. In English, the children are working hard to improve their sentence skills, focusing on writing more clearly and confidently. It has been a fantastic few weeks filled with enthusiasm, progress, and new learning experiences!



CLASS 3

The pupils listened carefully, shared their ideas and discussed ways to care for the environment. They completed fun activities linked to his life and achievements. Everyone enjoyed learning about such an inspiring person.

Through interactive storytelling, drama and historical activities, children explored the Easter story and learned about Easter traditions celebrated by the Wesley family in the past.
