It has been another busy term and we wanted to share with you some of what has been happening in classes throughout school.

## CLASS 1

In EYFS the children have been learning about real-life superheroes—people in our community who help and protect others. As part of this topic, they met a visiting nurse who explained her role, showed some of the equipment she uses and talked about how she cares for people who are unwell. The children also welcomed local police officers, who shared how they keep people safe and showed their uniforms and vehicle. These experiences helped the children understand important community roles and inspired imaginative role-play, where they acted as nurses and police officers while developing communication and teamwork skills.



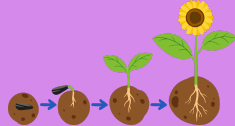
## CLASS 2

This term the children in Class 2 have had lots of fun exploring art through colour. They have been learning about monochromatic and chromatic art by looking at how artists use different colours in their work. The children really enjoyed working with paint and experimenting with primary and secondary colours by mixing them to see what new colours they could make. They also explored warm and cold colours and talked about how they can change the feeling of a picture. Everyone had a go at creating their own colourful pieces of artwork, and it has been great to see their creativity and confidence grow while trying out new ideas and techniques.



## CLASS 3

Class 3 have been enjoying learning about what plants need to grow as part of their new science unit on Plants and Nature. They discovered that plants need water, sunlight, air, nutrients from soil, and space to thrive. To understand this better, they conducted an experiment where they removed one vital thing at a time to see how the plants would grow. Some plants were given no water, others were kept in the dark, and some had no soil. The children carefully observed the changes and recorded their results, noticing how each missing element affected growth. They loved being scientists.



## CLASS 4



